2021 WORLD SCOUT MOOT

What’s a Moot?

Imagine a high-adventure world Scout jamboree for young adult Scouts, but on a smaller scale. Learn new cultures and make lasting friendships while participating in a variety of activities designed by the host country. The word *moot* is Old English and means “an assembly held for discussion.” That’s Moot—a once-in-a-lifetime world Scouting experience!

This official event of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) is being hosted and organized by Scouting Ireland, for young people from ages 18 through 25.

Make plans to join 5,000 participants and 1,000 IST (staff) from at least 80 countries around the world at the Moot.

COUNCIL INTERNATIONAL EVENT GUIDELINE

If your council is planning to host international Scouts as participants at a local council event, the International Department will work with your event registrar to verify that contingent leaders and International Service Team (IST/staff) members are registered and approved by their own WOSM Scout association to attend your event.

This may seem like an unnecessary step in your event planning, but it can be crucial to your event's success. At a previous large-council event, only 85 percent of the contingent leaders and 78 percent of the IST that applied were approved by their Scout association. Contact the International Department at International@scouting.org to verify the registration and approval of your international Scouts.

INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION

The International Department manages the requirements for two awards, the International Spirit Award and the International Scouters' Award.

To introduce your Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Venturer, or Scouter to international Scouting, we recommend the International Spirit Award. Earning this award is a great way to gain knowledge about international Scouting while developing appreciation and awareness of different cultures and countries. BRONZE WOLF AWARD

We are pleased to report that BSA International Committee Member Kent Clayburn and BSA International Ambassador Brigitte Therivel were formally presented the Bronze Wolf Award at the BSA's National Annual Meeting closing banquet on Friday, May 25, 2018.

The Bronze Wolf Award is bestowed by the World Scout Committee to acknowledge "outstanding service by an individual to the World Scout Movement." It is the highest honor that can be given to a volunteer Scout leader in the world, and it is the only award given by the World Scout Committee. Since the award's creation in 1935, fewer than 400 of the several millions of Scouts throughout the world have received the award. SILVER WORLD AWARD

The Silver World Award is a distinguished service award of the Boy Scouts of America. It is presented for noteworthy and extraordinary service to youth on an international basis. Recipients must be a citizen of a country with a Scouting program that is a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement. Registered members of the BSA are not eligible for this award.

Two individuals were recognized and presented with the award at the BSA's National Annual Meeting closing banquet on Friday, May 25, 2018: João Armando Gonçalves of Associação dos Escoteiros de Portugal, past chairperson of the World Scout Committee, and Jemima Nartemle Nartey of the Ghana Scout Association, vice chairperson of the World Scout Committee.

João and Jemima are only the 124th and 125th recipients of this award.

We were honored to recognize João and Jemima for their selfless dedication and years of outstanding service to youth.

a positive impact on the BSA and world Scouting. His guidance as the International Committee chair changed the course of its governance and spurred a more active role for youth in the committee. NATIONAL EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBER ANNOUNCED AS NEW INTERNATIONAL COMMISSIONER

The Boy Scouts of America is pleased to announce that D. Kent Clayburn of Moraga, California, has been confirmed by the BSA's National Executive Board as the new BSA international commissioner. In this position, he will again be chairman of the International Committee, a role that he previously held from 2006–2010.

He has served the BSA at every level, focusing his efforts on promoting international Scouting programs that help increase membership retention and growth while encouraging Scouts to become active citizens of the world.

Mr. Clayburn held many unit and district positions before becoming a district chair, council president, area president, USFIS Committee member, and National Executive Board member of the BSA. On the World Scouting platform, he held the role of vice chairman of the Interamerican Region Committee, was elected as a member of the World Scout Foundation, and is currently serving as chairman of the World Scout Foundation Investment Committee.

He served on the staffs of six BSA national Scout jamborees and four world Scout jamborees. After serving as the deputy camp chief



during the 2011 World Scout Jamboree in Sweden, he has accepted the role of director of operations for the 2019 World Scout Jamboree North American Host Team.

A third-generation Eagle Scout, Mr. Clayburn is a recipient of the District Award of Merit, the Silver Beaver Award, the Silver Antelope Award, the Silver Buffalo Award, and the Bronze Wolf Award. He supports world Scouting through memberships in the World Baden-Powell Fellowship, the Interamerican Region Order of the Condor, and the Kandersteg International Scout Center Life Member Association.

Outside of Scouting, Mr. Clayburn is an active community volunteer. As president of the San Francisco Bond Club, he raised funds to bring financial education to both public and private high schools. He has worked with boys and girls in youth sports programs and coached high school basketball for 10 years.

A senior vice president with UBS, Mr. Clayburn holds a bachelor's degree from California State University–Chico and a master's degree in business administration from St. Mary's College, California.

Mr. Clayburn and his wife, Constance, are proud parents to their daughter Alexis and Eagle Scout son Evan.
