Because offerings differ from year to year, there are no distinct codes for individual Philmont Training Center, Sea Base, or Summit Bechtel Reserve conferences. A single code for any national commissioner training conference attended at one of those locations is now available. Distinct codes are available for each College of Commissioner Science degree plus attendance of Commissioner College Continuing Education courses. A code for “Advanced Commissioner Training” is available to recognize the variety of other commissioner training opportunities that may be available through local workshops, conferences, etc.

Who is considered a Trained Commissioner?

A trained Commissioner has completed basic training and onboarding. A commission will be presented to a new commissioner after completing both. Completion also triggers display of the “Trained” emblem in my.scouting tools.

Once Commissioned are we done with training?

Actually, we have only begun! We know in our role as a commissioner our training never ends. As commissioners, we must continually adjust our skills to provide valuable service to our units. Commissioners should view continuous learning as essential to their success.
